Basketball: Sunday from 3:30-4:30pm at North Sydney Sports Centre (Crows Nest) and 4-5:30pm at The Brickpit Sports Stadium (Thornleigh).

Cricket: Monday from 5-6pm at Mark Taylor Oval in Waitara (only in summer).

Dance: Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday at various locations.

Football: Wednesday from 6-7pm at North Sydney Police Citizens Youth Club.

Golf: Wednesday from 4-5:30pm at Avondale Golf Course (Pymble)

Gymnastics: Saturday from 5:45-6:45pm at Hornsby RSL Gymnastics Club.

Softball: Sunday from 10-11:30am at St Ives Village Green.

Swimming: Monday, Tuesday, Saturday and Sunday at various locations.

Tennis: Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Saturday at various locations.

Tenpin Bowling: Thursday and Saturday at various locations.

Young Athletes: A multi-sport program for young children. Coming soon to various locations near you.
