


## Mind Matters

The Mind Matters committee ran a successful workshop on the So Safe framework. The So Safe program consists of a set of visual and conceptual tools to promote social safety in a very structured manner for children and adults with an intellectual disability or young children. We use So Safe at Cromehurst as part of our positive well-being framework. At the workshop we presented some of the resources and lessons that we use at school and that can also be used at home. Some of the key concepts of So Safe are as follows:

- People are classified into categories including 'people I don't know', 'community workers I know', 'friends', 'family' in a 'Talk/Touch Triangle'.
- Physical contact is classified according to categories of relationships.
- There are public and private locations and public and private parts of the body.
- Consent should be given before physical contact is initiated.

Below is the version of the 'Talk/Touch Triangle' used at Cromehurst.



Thank you to all family members who attended the workshop. The feedback was very positive and we will run more workshops about school programs next year.


