This may include making arrangements directly with the service provider as part of their NDIS funded supports.

Alternatively, families should discuss any additional transport needs with their NDIA planner. Assisted School Travel services are primarily for transport between home and school and new transport services are not created for the sole purpose of transport to and from a respite or similar specialist disability service. Please refer to the ASTP Guidelines regarding respite. These still apply. The guidelines can be found on the ASTP website at: https:// education.nsw.gov.au/policylibrary/associated-documents/ guidelines.pdf."


