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Principal's Message

Welcome to week three

This Wednesday, 31 October will be a very busy day here at Cromehurst School. We are in the process of creating a new updated video of our school and the programs that operate here. The new video will reflect the new buildings and school environment as our current video was created prior to the rebuilding of our school in 2013. The new school video will be shown at school organised fundraising and promotional events. The video will only be shown at school-organised events and will not be available on mainstream internet. Students may be filmed participating in a range of activities as part of a group or individually and no names will be used in the video. A permission note was emailed to families last Friday but I have included another copy in this week's newsletter. Please return the form to school by Wednesday, 31 October for organizational purposes.

Work experience programs are an important component of our secondary school program. One of our very successful work sites is Packforce, which several of our students attend. Packforce also provide a post school program for students upon the completion of year twelve. The staff at Packforce have suggested to us that families of students who are in their final years of school should visit them over the next few weeks as the lead up to Christmas is a very busy time and the full range of programs operate every day the centre is open. This means that parents will be able to see all of the activities and supported work programs that may assist in the future planning for their children. Packforce is very keen for families to contact them and I would encourage you to do so, they can be contacted

As we move towards the end of the school year, we are beginning to reflect and evaluate the progress of the strategic direction of our school plan and the programs and practices that support these directions. As you know, Positive resilient learners is one of our directions and is a strong focus here at Cromehurst School. Our school is committed to employing programs and practices that have a strong research proven evidence base and we continually engage in professional reading and learning to ensure that our programs reflect this. The Centre for Education, Statistics and Evaluation (CESE) has conducted research into improving student engagement and achievement and the results validate the well-being focus and programs at our school including PBEL, MindMatters, So Safe and Live Life Well. The evidence is strong that adopting a school-wide strategy to manage and support student behaviour decreases problem behaviour and is associated with improved academic outcomes (Luiselli et al. 2005; Wilson et al. 2003). The international literature points to two different school-wide approaches: positive behaviour support programs that communicate and teach expectations (and reward students for following them); and social and emotional learning that promotes self-management, social awareness, relationship skills and responsible decision-making (Durlak et al. 2011). Although not unexpected, it is good to know that we are providing the teaching and learning programs that are proven to maximise student engagement and performance.

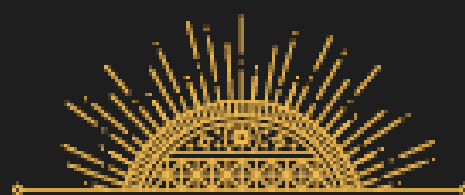
On an exciting note, we are delighted to announce the



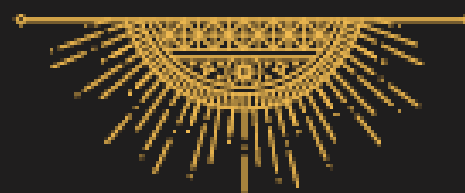

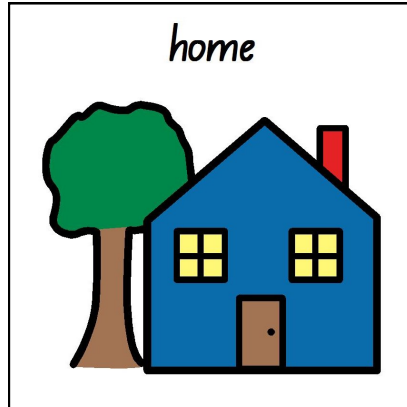

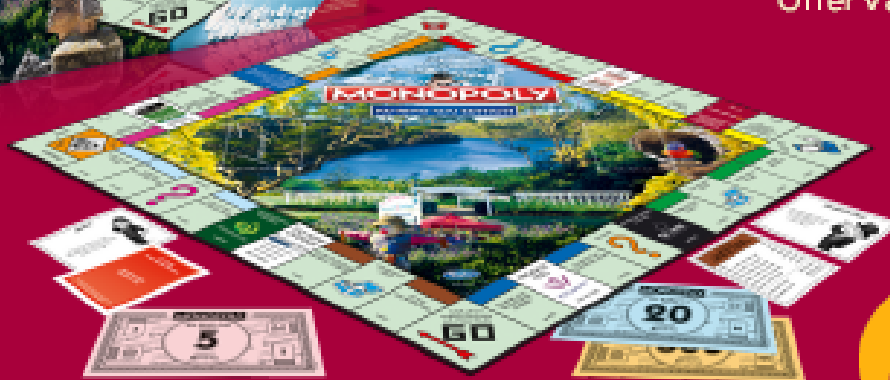
