# Principal's Message

Welcome to week nine.

Last week's intense heatwave was uncomfortable for students and staff alike. I would like to reassure parents that when we have extreme weather we do not take the students outside during break times, but they have recess and lunch inside as they do if it is raining. This is also the case when the air



quality is considered unsafe due to bushfire smoke. We were fortunate to be able to conduct our whole school Aboriginal culture assembly as the weather on Wednesday morning was not too hot. It was a very successful and enjoyable interactive event in which all classes participated. Photos of this event are included later in the newsletter.

This week is Harmony Week which celebrates Australia's cultural diversity and includes the <u>United Nations' International Day for Elimination of Racial Discrimination</u>. The ongoing theme 'everyone belongs' promotes respect for everyone from all cultural backgrounds and encourages inclusion. This includes the ongoing custodians of the land on which we live, to those who have come from the many countries around the world. We will be holding a special whole school Harmony Week assembly this Wednesday and we ask, if possible, that you dress your child in clothing that reflects their cultural background. If that is not possible provide clothing item(s) that are orange which is the official colour for Harmony Week.

Cyber safety has a strong focus in the Department of Education along with the appropriate use of digital devices during school hours. NSW Department of Education provides guidelines, procedures and safe and secure technology-related resources, equipment and infrastructure to help protect students from harm and create environments where students can benefit from using technology. This is represented through the 'student use of digital devices and online services policy'. This policy limits the use of digital devices to those required for lessons or if approved by the Principal for other purposes. Primary school students must not use digital devices during class, at recess and at lunch unless approved by a Principal or teacher. Exemptions may be granted by a Principal or teacher, including allowing students to use a device for an educational purpose, or as part of a reasonable adjustment for student learning and wellbeing.

# Principal's Message (continued)

Every school is required to have a school based policy to support the Department's policy. Cromehurst School is committed to supporting and managing students' use of digital devices and online services. At all times Cromehurst staff promote the learning, safety and wellbeing of students and the management of any risk of harm and distraction from the use of digital technology devices. Cromehurst School supports the learning of primary and secondary students with moderate and severe intellectual disabilities. Many of our students have secondary disabilities and rely on augmentative devices in order to communicate. Digital technology is becoming an important tool to enhance the learning of our students and prepare them for life beyond school

Use of digital devices outside of the restriction guidelines will be in consultation with families and staff and documented within the student's Individual Educational Program. Reasons for granting exemption to the policy for wellbeing or reasonable adjustment include the following:

- Use of a digital device for communication purposes.
- Use of digital devices as part of a documented Behaviour Support Plan.
- Use of digital devices as a calming strategy for students experiencing anxiety.

In regard to students' personal devices, as per the Department's policy, all care will be taken however the school is not responsible for any damages that occur to a student's personal device which occurs at school.

Finally, a reminder that vaccinations for year seven students are scheduled to occur tomorrow Tuesday, 21 March. Parental consent is required before the date in order for the vaccination to proceed and from this year is provided online. If you have not already provided consent for this please visit <a href="https://nswhealth.service-now.com/school">https://nswhealth.service-now.com/school</a>, you will need:

- your Service NSW log-in details, or to <u>create an account with ServiceNSW</u> if you don't already have one;
- Medicare details for parents/carers and your child.

Last Wednesday the whole school participated in an Aboriginal Cultural assembly. It was an interactive event enjoyed by all. Here are some photos of the day.

















